

Lead Tutor/Mentor (or Program Leader)

Project: VISION (www.projectvisionchicago.org) is a small grassroots nonprofit organization that provides free after school programming to youth in Chicago's Chinatown, Bridgeport, and surrounding neighborhoods. We are seeking Lead Tutor/Mentors to work with our Program Coordinators and Managers to provide our grades 6-8 and grades 9-12 youth with after school tutoring, enrichment, and mentoring activities. We are seeking candidates with strong personal academic records, leadership skills, and enthusiasm and passion for teaching and mentoring.

Responsibilities:

- Provide supervision and support to a team of 6-8 tutors/mentors and facilitate daily workflow to
 ensure students are getting adequate academic support each day
- Work with Program Coordinators to plan and deliver daily enrichment activities (STEM, language arts, and social-emotional learning) to small groups of youth
- Function as tutor, by providing students with homework help, checking work, subject tutoring, and assisting with test preparation
- Function as a role model and provide mentoring (using a provided curriculum) to students
- Support Program Coordinators with tutor/mentor training, supervision, and evaluation
- Support program data collection, maintaining student progress reports, and other program administrative needs

The Program Leader position will perform all of the above responsibilities and in addition will:

- Serve as the lead staff of an afterschool program at a school-based site (20-30 youth)
- Ensure the safety of all youth at the school site
- Support the Program Coordinator to work with school staff and administration to

Qualifications:

- Must have college sophomore standing or higher
- Must have experience working with youth in the 11-14 and/or 14-18+ age groups
- Professional, organized, reliable, punctual, self motivated and team player
- Excellent communication skills
- Experience with supervising others and/or leadership position(s) preferred

Shifts are available Mondays-Fridays 3-7p. Shifts may take place in-person at the PV Center or onsite at local schools. Tutor/Mentors and Program Leaders must be able to commit to working at least three shifts (minimum 3 hours per shift) each week through the end of the academic school year (June 6, 2024). Candidates who are able to work 4-5 shifts per week will be prioritized.

Compensation: \$20/hour (Program Leaders will be compensated for travel time to schools.)
